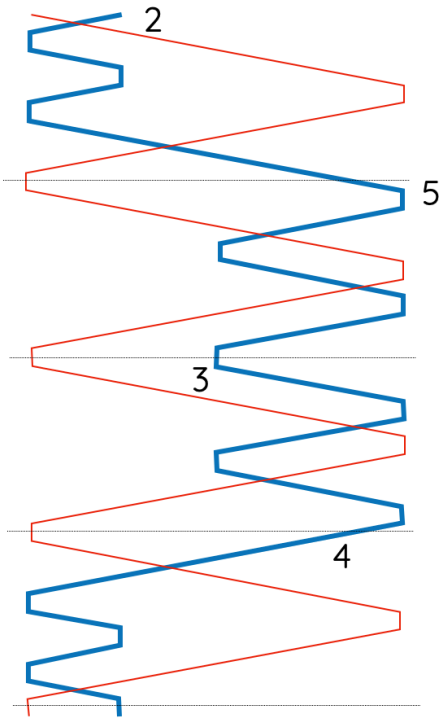




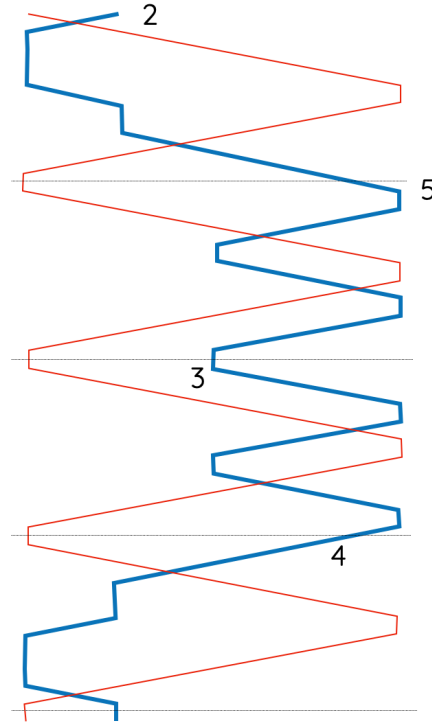

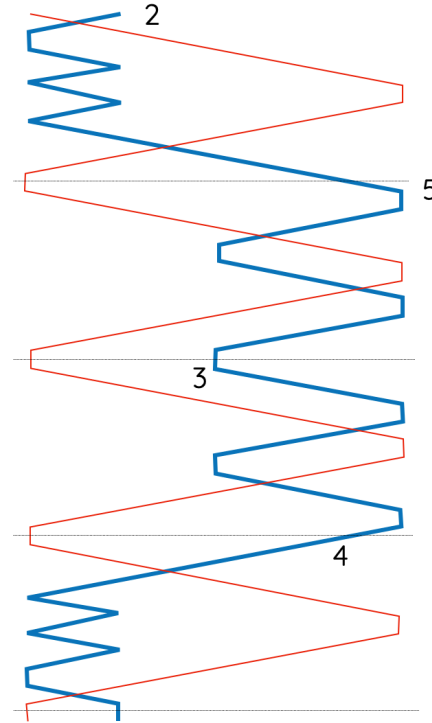
Bampton Place



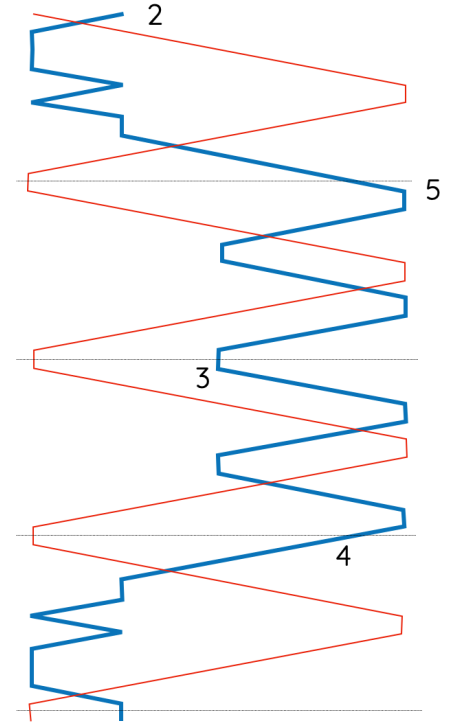
St Ouen Place

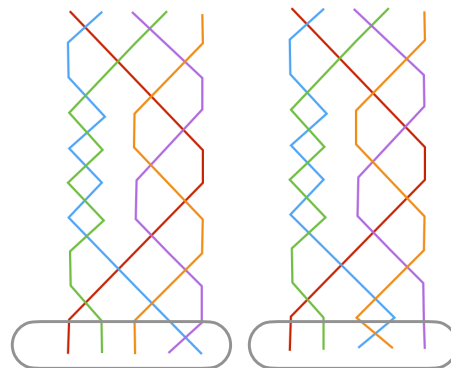


Fifield



- Related to St Martin's, Eynesbury St Simon's and St Osmund's...
 - Same Front work... same back work.
 - Standard plain hunt starts.
 - 123 Lead End is the only difference.
- Different coursing and place bell order...
 - St Simon's Group 2, 4, 5, 3.
 - Twynham Group 2, 4, 3, 5.

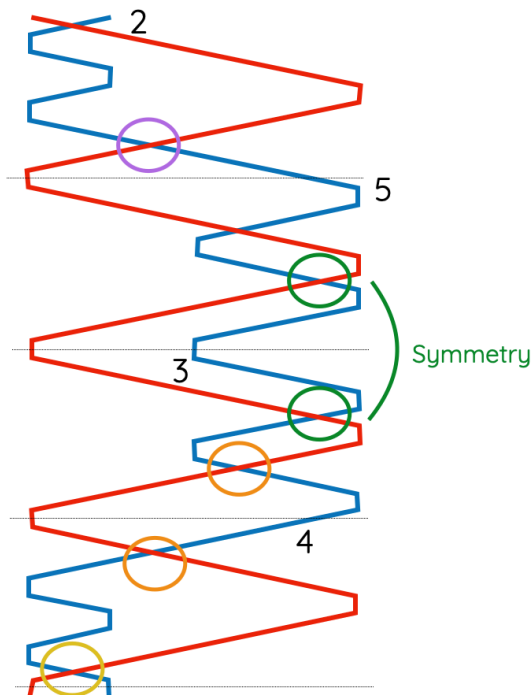
Twynham St Simon's



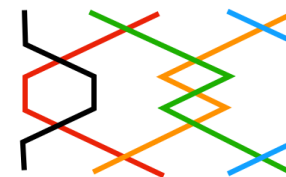
- Because of the different lead end...
 - 4th place bell will still make seconds as before
 - 2nd place will plain hunt (run out) and start the back work (5th place bell).
 - 5th place bell will make thirds and do the second half of the back work.
 - 3rd place bell will plain hunt (run in) and start the front work...
- The back work has **no dodges**... just hunting between 3rds and 5ths 4 times.

Working with the Treble

- Because the working bell duo two leads at the front and two leads at the back... the treble will not pass bells in the same order up and down... a-b-c-d will become c-d-a-b on the return.
- Passing the Treble...
 - Pass the treble in 2-3... go to the back and become 5th place bell.
 - Pass the treble in 4-5... you are the pivot bell... lie, 3rds, lie and pass treble in 5-4 down.
 - Pass the treble in 3-4... Lie and then start the front work... passing the treble in 3-2 on the way down.
 - Pass the treble in 1-2... Make Seconds... 2nds place bell.



Bobs



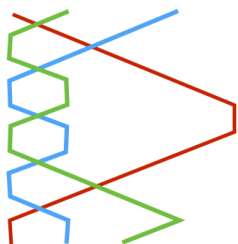
- Normal Bobs (145) will not work with a 123 lead end. So we use 125 Bobs... (a normal as St Martin's or Plain Bob lead end).
 - 4ths Place bell will make second's and be unaffected...
 - 2nds place bell will dodge 3-4 up becoming 3rds place bell...
 - 5th place bell dodges 3-4 down to become 4th place bell...
 - 3rds place bell makes 4 Blows behind to become 5th place bell.

Alternative Front Works...

- Just like St Martin's, you can vary the front work and still use the same back work, calls and touches.
- There are four different options.

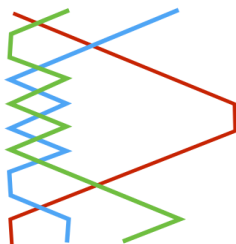
Bampton

(Like St Martin's)
lead + 2 places...



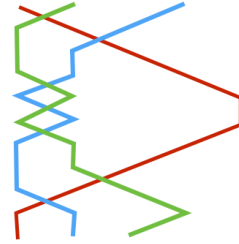
Twineham

(Like St Simon's)
Lead + 2 dodges



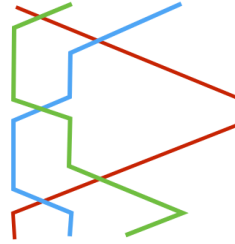
Fifield

(Like St Osmund's)
Lead + 1 reversed dodge



St Ouen

(Like Eynesbury)
Lead + reversed places



Touches

- There are 4 possibilities for touches.
 - A bob course which is 4 leads, (so the same length as a plain course)
 - Alternate leads will yield 60 changes... which is ideal for the final element in a quarter peal. (call either 3 or 5, four behind 3x).
 - Call any bell as 2nds observation. (4 possibilities)
 - Miss 1 lead per course... the observation is the bell making seconds... but it is affected...
